Prior to the nineteenth century, most tall buildings throughout the world were made of stone. However, this contributed to many hazardous conditions. Obviously, there was heavy weight involved in the construction of such buildings, and many catastrophes occurred as a result of earthquakes and other natural disasters. So, at the end of the 19th century, an architect in France constructed a great steel tower known as the Eiffel Tower. Soon thereafter in America, several tall steel buildings began to appear. One of the most magnificent of these was the Empire State Building.

The Empire State Building, located in the heart of Manhattan, was constructed in 1930 to 1931. At 102 floors, it was the tallest building in the world for a number of years. It is used primarily as an office building, but the top of the building is also a popular tourist attraction. The observation deck at the top has been featured prominently in several movies, including *King Kong*, *An Affair to Remember*, and *Sleepless in Seattle*.

The architect behind this great structure was John Jacob Raskob. In order to build his dream, he borrowed \$50 million, which of course sounds miniscule by today's standards. His only instructions to those he employed were to build something tall and build it fast. His Fifth Avenue structure is considered to this day to be one of the greatest buildings in the United States. Even though many are taller, its history and the magnificent view from the top have helped its popularity endure throughout the decades.
